

BIO-DIVERSITY POLICY

Background

Under the Natural Environment and Rural Communities Act 2006 there is a duty on public authorities in England, including Town Councils to have regard to conserving biodiversity as part of their policy or decision making. This was further strengthened by the Environment Act 2021 so public authorities must now consider what they can do to conserve and enhance biodiversity in England. This means a public authority must;

- Consider what they can do to conserve and enhance biodiversity.
- Agree policies and specific objectives based on their consideration.
- Act to deliver policies and achieve objectives .

Biodiversity refers to the variety of life on earth¹. Biodiversity is everywhere: in gardens, fields, hedgerows, mountains, rivers and the sea.

The Local Area

Corby Town Council is a town, with a considerable number of natural areas, including historic forests and woodlands.

What the Town Council will do

- Consider the impact on biodiversity in the decisions made through the Town Council, especially when commenting on planning applications.
- The Parish Council will look to promote biodiversity via the Town Council website and social media.
- Support local businesses and council operations in the adoption of low impact / nature positive practices.
- Encourage and support other organisations within the town to manage their areas of responsibility with biodiversity in mind.
- Support residents and local organisation activities to enhance and promote biodiversity.
