

In **2022/23** we raised a precept of **£314,000.00** which is the proportion of your Council Tax paid to the Town Council. This meant for a person living in a Band D property this was **37p** per week. Despite being a large town this is one of the lowest precepts in the county.

In **2023/24** we are consulting on either :

- An 8p a week increase for a Band D property which would generate £385,000.00

8p a week

- A 10p a week increase which would generate an income of £400,000.00

10p per week

- A 15p per week increase which would generate an income of £445,000.00

15p per week

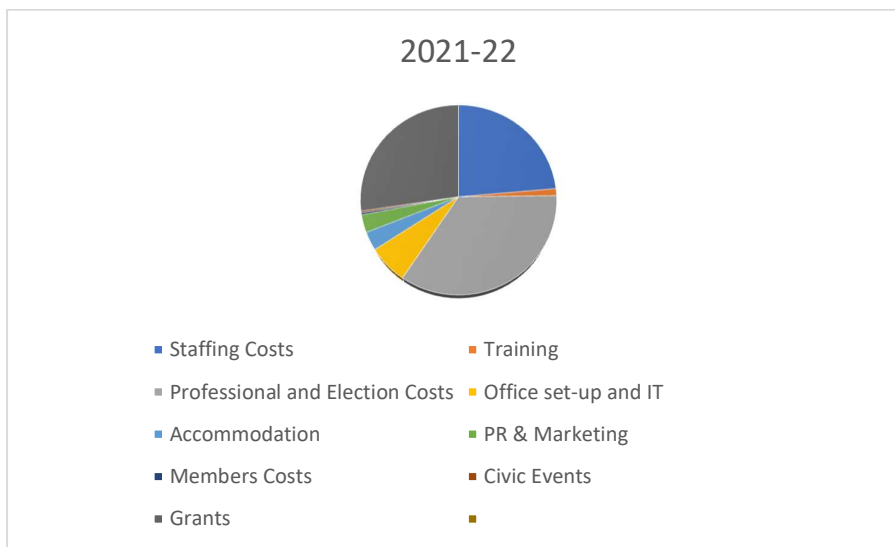
Depending on the level of increase this will pay for the following :

- Corby's first ever Pride event
- The King's Coronation event
- The increased cost of inflation on accommodation and other external costs
- Ward funding for the four areas of Corby
- The formation of a youth council
- Increased staffing and insurance costs to deliver the existing programme of events as they build in the town
- Building up reserves so we have a good platform to take the town of Corby into the future where we may own assets or operate services.

This consultation will run from Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December until midnight on the 8<sup>th</sup> January 2023. A decision regarding the budget and precept will be made at our Full Council meeting on 17<sup>th</sup> January 2023.
